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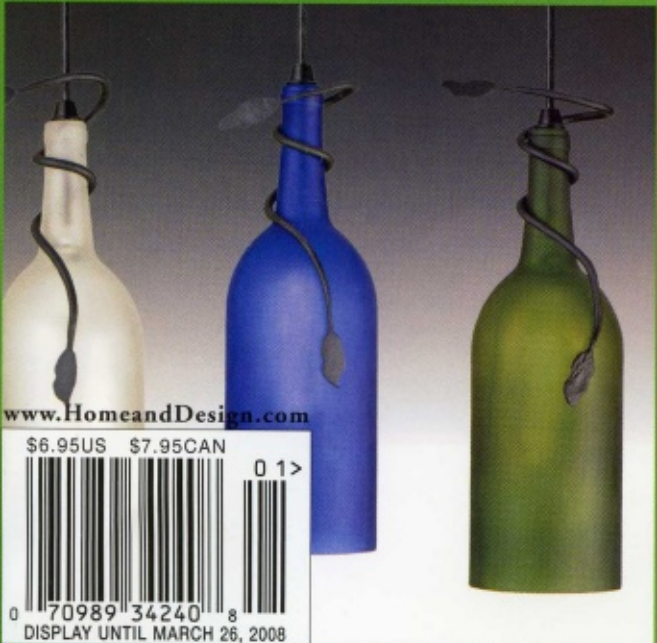
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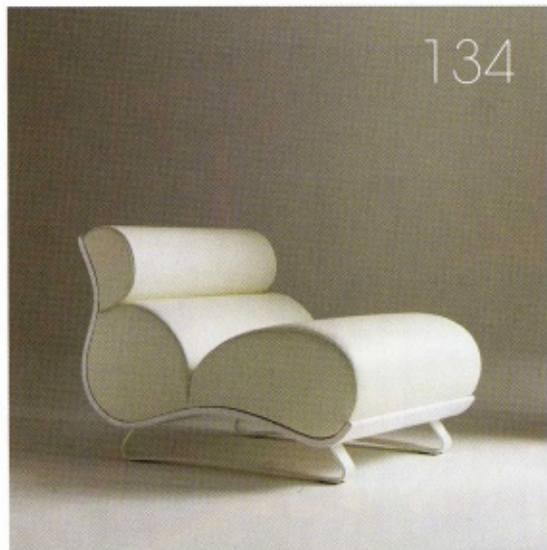
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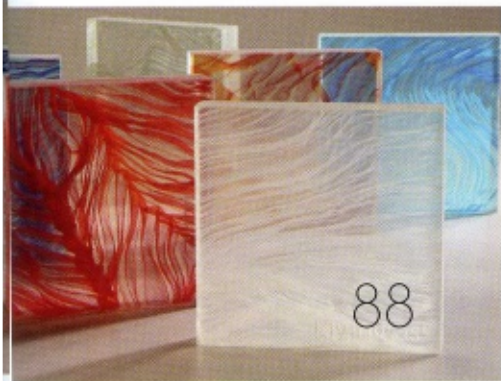
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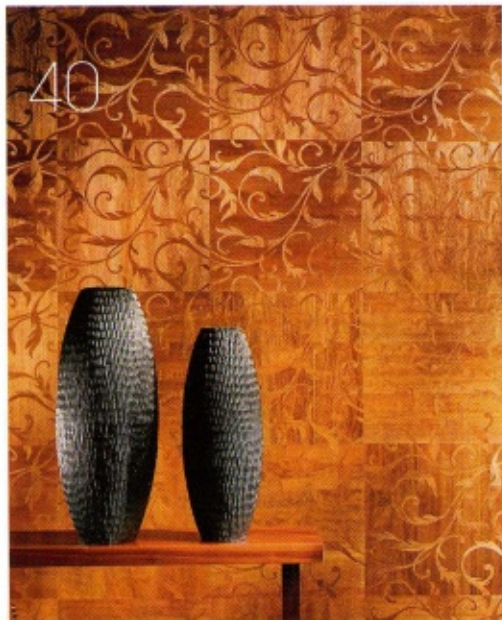


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Spring Into Green

A dose of color evokes the season

Never underestimate the power of color. That's the mantra Washington, DC-based designer Liz Levin kept tucked away in her arsenal of design weapons for this Arlington, Virginia, project. "The formal living room is the nucleus of this home," she explains, "so I wanted it to be bright and unique but not too trendy." The result is an eclectic, comfortably modern room brimming with practicality as well as personality.

"I wanted to keep the bigger pieces quiet and neutral, which would allow the accessories to pop," says Levin. She chose an ivory and black herringbone tuxedo-style sofa and balanced the angular piece by including a dark art deco-styled console with an undulating front façade. But it's the set of springtime-inspired chartreuse camelback chairs, the original painting by the homeowner over the mantel and quirky accent pieces distributed around the room that make it feel fresh. "The clear Lucite waterfall coffee table also reminds me of spring because it allows the natural light to shine through," says Levin.

Springtime is also about letting go and that's exactly the approach taken by Levin with regard to the room's whimsical accessories, such as the lime-green lamp with an orange linen shade and family photos in irregularly patterned frames. "The homeowner did not want the space to be formal, so I incorporated lots of personal effects to give it a more relaxed feel," she says.
